anti-human CD20 Biotin-conjugated

Clone: LT20

Specificity: The antibody LT20 reacts with CD20 (Bp35), a 33-37 kDa non glycosylated membrane receptor with four transmembrane domains, expressed on B lymphocytes (it is lost on plasma cells), follicular dendritic cells and at low levels on peripheral blood T lypmphocytes.

Immunogen: Normal human lymphocytes from lymph node

Isotype subclass: Mouse IgG2a

Form:

The purified antibody is conjugated with Biotin-LC-NHS under optimum conditions. The reagent is free of unconjugated Biotin.

Physical state: Liquid

Buffer/Additives/Preservative:

PBS containing BSA and 0.09 % sodium azide (pH 7.4)

Expiration date:

The reagent is stable until the expiry date stated on the vial label

Storage conditions:

Store at 4 °C. For long-term storage aliquot and store at -20 °C. Avoid freeze/thaw cycles.
